AIS Processes and Procedures Considering the Current Situation
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Data Used for Initial Placement

- Overall course average in 2019-2020
- AIMS Web from January 2019
- NYS Exams from Spring 2018
- Teacher Recommendations - curriculum based assessments



AIMS Web testing for 2020-2021

- October 2020 - AIMS Web testing for all K-5 student and 6-8 students already assigned to AIS
 - Hybrid students assessed on in person instruction days
 - Fully distance learning students offered 2 choice:
 - Come in on a Wednesday to complete assessment
 - Virtual assessment (parents supplied a how to guide to support student)
- Plan for winter and spring benchmarking



How is AIS being implemented

- AIS teachers and core area teachers are collaborating to focus on skill based instruction aligned to curriculum
- Students scheduled in AIS group based on similar needs
- Setting up virtual activities and supports for fully remote students or hybrid students on remote days
 - Weekly skill development plan that aligned to curriculum
- In person time - balance immediate needs of student in core content areas with longer term skill and strategy based support
- AIS teachers are hosting virtual support sessions for remote students



Challenges

- Remote engagement can be low
- At best seeing students in person once a week
- Remote skill and strategy based instruction not as effective as in person
- Balancing helping students complete regular core area content work and development of skills and strategies
