District Priorities

- Improve student achievement based on multiple measures for all students
- Support the development of staff by providing high quality professional learning opportunities
- Continue the implementation of new New York State learning standards in all content areas including social emotional learning and mental health.
- Increase student attendance
- Constantly focus on improving students literacy including disciplinary literacy in content areas in addition to ELA
- Focus on cultural, climate, and morale for students and staff
- Develop and begin to implement District Comprehensive Improvement Plan in accordance with requirements of New York State Department of Education under ESSA regulations
- Evaluate and improve distance learning to be responsive to the current and potential future distance learning

Continue to Build and Leverage Partnerships

- Continue to expand collaboration with County agencies such as ARISE to fully support students and families
 - Continue to develop relationships with the County to support our students and families
 - Continue to participate in county wide discussions with agencies and school districts to improve systematic change and support for students and families
- Continue and expand the Syracuse University/Solvay partnership
- Further develop relationship with OCC to offer students more opportunities to earn college credit in high school and successfully advance to college coursework upon graduation
- Support the availability of diverse college level course offerings through Syracuse University, SUNY Environmental Science and Forestry, Cayuga Community College, and Tompkins-Cortland Community College

District Achievements

- Solvay students were awarded a total of 1,673 credit hours
- First cohort of OCC Advantage students are graduating from Solvay High School and are able to receive two years of free tuition at OCC.
- First and Second cohorts of Solvay Success Academy (allows the option of concurrently completing a high school diploma and an associates degree from OCC) successfully completed this year's program.
- Student graduated in June 2019 with an OCC associates degree along with her high school diploma
- 95% Graduation Rate
- Improvement in elementary school state level assessment measures in ELA and math
- Re Establishment of district wide distributed leadership and collaboration
- 150 of programs offered through the 21st Century Grant BEST program with over 750 of students participating in the program for at least 30 hours

Capital Projects and Facilities Improvements

- The \$28,242,000 capital project continues to progress
 - Solvay Middle School roof project and main entrance renovation to improve security completed
 - Maintenance storage facility completed
 - Solvay Transportation Center completed
 - Solvay High School renovation including the auditorium initiated
- At Solvay Elementary School the sidewalks on the bus deck were renovated



20-21 Budget Challenges

- Revenue
 - Tax Cap Restrictions
 - Unknown State aid State Budget Crisis
- Expenses:
 - Increasing salary & benefit costs
 - Unknowns for how we will operate

- Executive budget included a foundation aid increase of \$345k based on a tiered system needier districts received more money. This increase was taken away in legislative budget.
- Foundation aid continues to be an issue NO increase in amount from 19/20. If fully funded Solvay would receive \$3.9m more
- Includes Pandemic Adjustment of \$390,123 State Aid reduction replaced by Federal CARES \$ - school districts will need to apply
- Further State Aid Reductions (% of what??? When??) can be made during the following measurement periods:
 - April 1-30
 - May 1 June 30
 - July 1 December 31
