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Academics and Education

Academic Support/AIS

Study Halls and After-School Academic Assistance

SUFSD provides study periods, homework help sessions, and after-school make-up work/tests during the regular school day or after-school, Monday-Thursdays. Students should arrange extra help or “stay after” appointments with their specific teachers.

School-based Behavioral, Social & Emotional Supports

Family Support for Student Success Program

Solvay School District partners with Onondaga County Department of Children and Family Services/CCSI Inc., to provide year round services for students and families with life challenges. The interventions provided by FSSS are based on the knowledge that every family wants their child to be successful, and every child has the potential for success. FSSS’ overall goal is to increase student success by improving family functioning, decreasing risk, ensuring access to needed supports and services, and increasing parent

Promise Zone is a school-based (K-12) mental health program that matches students' emotional and behavioral needs with effective, targeted interventions designed to develop skills and increase engagement in instructional time through a multi-tiered system of support. This program is managed by *Coordinated Care Services Inc.*, on behalf of Onondaga County, Department of Children and Family Services, Division of School Based Initiatives. Solvay Schools partner with *Peaceful Schools* to provide District-wide student support services. The SELI provides small-group social skill instruction, structured conflict resolution. The SEL Interventionist will support students' social-emotional health and development. Partners with teachers to develop strategies for student success.

[Mental Health Liaison](#)

The MHL provides direct support for students and community members. The MHL partners with individuals and families to tackle everyday challenges and navigate crisis situations. Services include: consultation, problem-solving, referrals and connections to school and community based resources. The MHL also provides ongoing mental health instruction and suicide prevention training.

The OCC Advantage program is a college and career-readiness program offered to entering freshmen at Solvay High School. The program supports the development of skills, behaviors and habits that prepare a student for success in high school, college and career. Students who successfully complete the OCC Advantage program while in high school will be eligible to receive a first semester full tuition scholarship with the opportunity to earn three subsequent semesters at Onondaga Community College. The OCC Advantage is a scholarship applied after any state or federal grants, public or private scholarship or other non- loan financial aid for which a student is qualified is applied to his/her account. Students will be responsible for room and board, books, supplies,

transportation and other expenses outside of full-time tuition and fees at Onondaga Community College.

Home-based Education (315-484-1412)

There are many reasons and special circumstances by which students participate in home-based instruction. When in-person learning is not an option, home-based or home-bound learning becomes compulsory. (School-aged students have the legal right to an education.)

Special Education

Special Education Services are provided to eligible students with specific learning disabilities. A team of qualified professionals make this determination after following a tiered process of testing, assessments and evaluations, sometimes including medical and other professional diagnostic examinations. Accommodations and Interventions vary and are targeted to individual student's specific needs. Common SPED services include enacting of an Instructional Educational Plan, (**IEP**) or a **504 Plan**, referring to section 504 of the US Department of Education Rehabilitation Act of 1973. To inquire about SPED Services, contact your School's Special Education Department. A formal letter requesting evaluation is usually required.

Giving up a pet is a very difficult and emotional decision. At CNYSPCA, we understand that some circumstances cannot be overcome and we offer shelter and care for these pets. We are only able to accept owner surrenders from Onondaga County. ***We are***

unable to accept animals that are in need of medical care or euthanasia or animals that have bitten. We cannot accept animals that show aggression toward people or other animals. For those services please contact your veterinarian. We can only accept animals based on available space and appointments MUST be made for surrender. At the present time, we are unable to take animals from outside of Onondaga County. The CNY SPCA is not able to take in feral cats.
