

Supports for Classroom Teachers

- Implement current reading and writing best practices
 - Annotating, Summarizing, Questioning, Monitoring, All Stages of Writing Process...Across the Content Areas
- Create engaging literacy based lessons, units, and projects
 - Increasing frequency and effectiveness of student Speaking and Listening
- Model and co-teach literacy lessons
- Cognitive Coaching planning and reflecting conversations



SMS Literacy Leadership Team

- Gathering and interpreting the school-wide literacy needs of SMS students
- Communicating these findings to staff and other stakeholders for their reflection and comment
- Prioritizing the student needs and collectively developing a literacy action plan, identifying:
 - Specific, measurable literacy goals for students
 - A set of transportable and transferable literacy strategies/teaching practices applicable to multiple content areas
- Promoting the use of these strategies and encouraging teachers to share their success stories with one another
- Conducting a review of the literacy action plan
